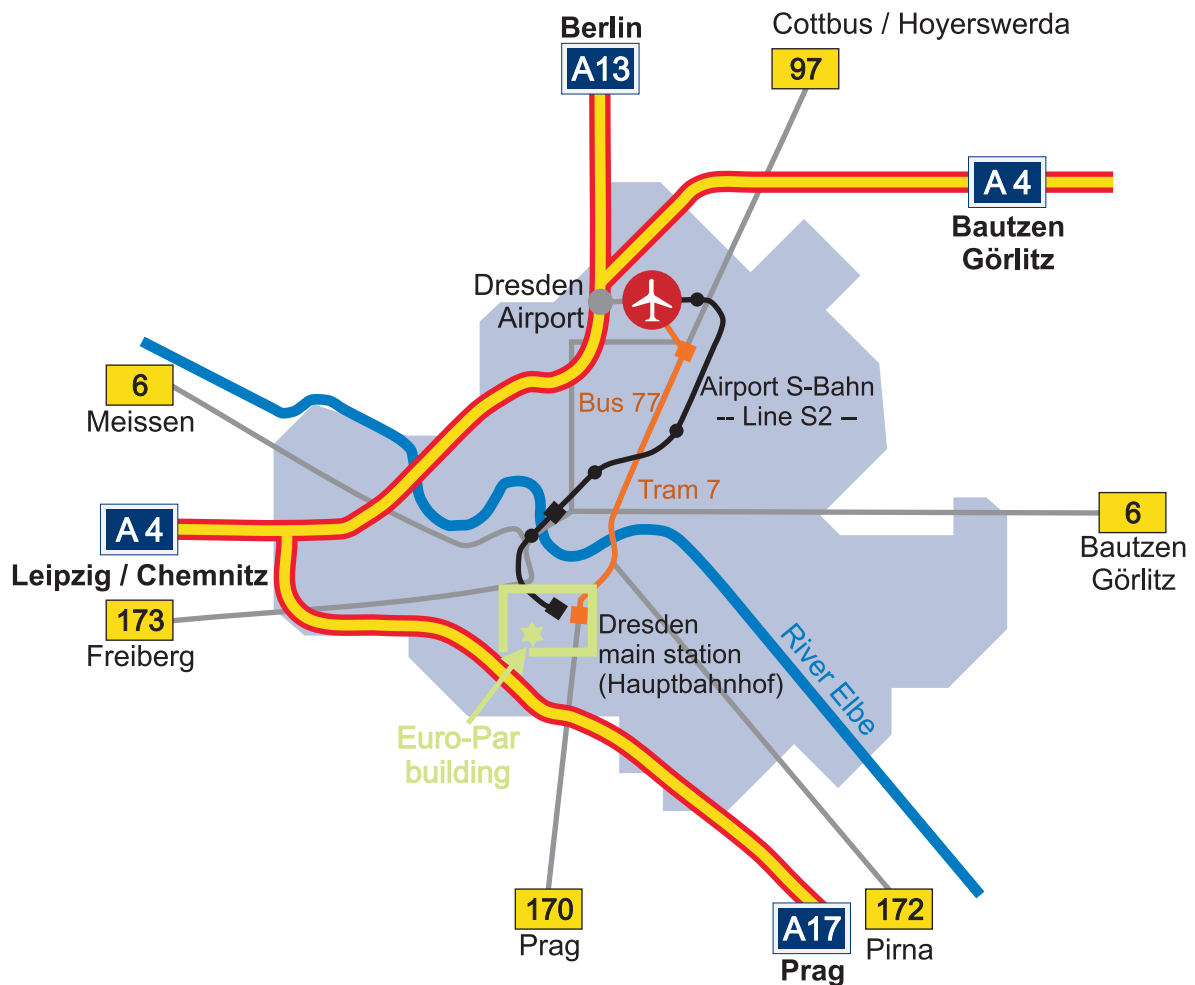


Terms of Transportation in Dresden

Whether arriving by airplane, train or car, Euro-Par 2006 attendees will find it easy to get to the city of Dresden. Travel within the city is also easy, thanks to a convenient and extensive system of trams, buses and regional rail service.

Dresden airport features a modern terminal (completed in 2001) and is served by a growing number of airlines offering an increasing number of flights to other cities in Europe. The airport is located 9 km northwest of the city center and is easily reached by automobile, train, tram and bus.

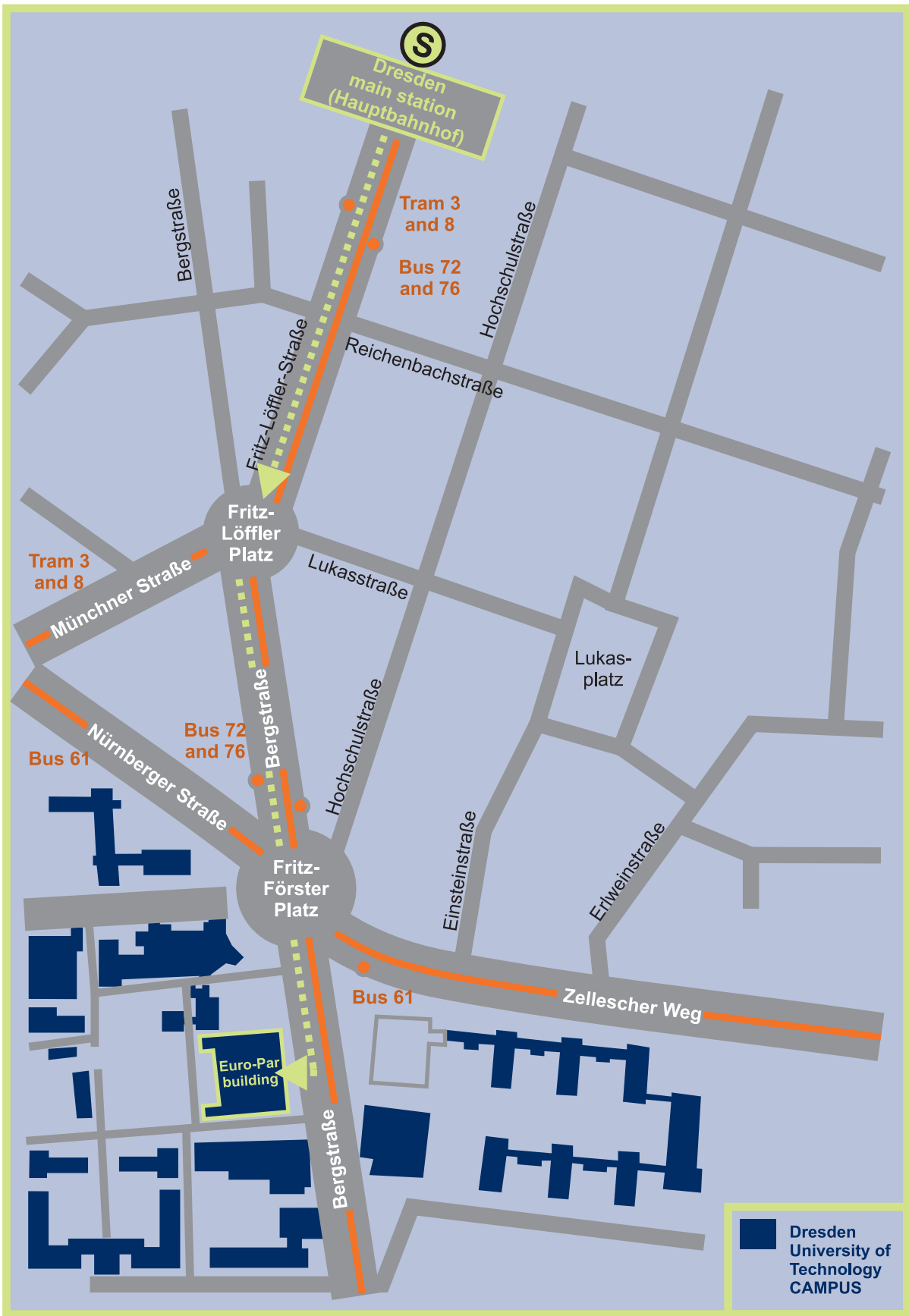
The new terminal provides modern and convenient service for travelers, with all services located within a central building. For travelers heading into the city, covered pedestrians walkways guide them to public transportation, taxis and rental car services.



The Airport S-Bahn (Line S2) station is on the lower level of the new terminal building. It takes you about 22 minutes to travel to Dresden main station (Hauptbahnhof). For detailed information concerning Line S2, see the timetable below:
